#### Community-engaged research

"...the process of working collaboratively with and through groups of people affiliated by geographic proximity, special interest, or similar situations to address issues affecting the well-being of those people"

Community engagement is grounded in the principles of community organization: fairness, justice, empowerment, participation, and self-determination...







## Community-engaged research can...

1.Democratize knowledge creation by centring local contexts and community expertise.

2. Build the capacity of communities/organizations to do research and grow their influence.

3. Broaden the impact of communities/organizations by using the research process as a way to build diverse coalitions of stakeholders.

4. Influence public policy by creating credible evidence for change.

#### Knowledge co-prodcution

- Participatory research methods involve collaboration and active engagement with local communities, acknowledging their perspectives as integral to the research process.
- Roles of academic and non-academic actors are blurred.
- Mixed group discussions and collaborations reduce the power imbalances that may exist outside the project.













#### Participatory action research (PAR)

Actively **involve affected communities** in the decision-making processes that impact their living environments




Facilitate their participation in cocreating **community-specific initiatives** for sustainable change.

**Be open** to debates and topics that emerge.

#### Participatory action research (PAR)

Structure meetings to allow for multiple informal discussions as well as more 'formal' presentation and group feedback sessions.

Structure other activities to require meaningful discussion such as codesigning or **co-writing**.

#### Lack of:


- 1. An integrative and relational vision of the industry-host community-landscape assemblage






## Sensing Living Lab

- 2. Envision possible futures












## Sensing Living Lab

World Cafe method



Link ideas within a larger group to access the collective intelligence in the room and propose solutions to a common issue.

A collaborative strategy that promotes an environment for structured discussions for sharing knowledge and perspectives.


## COMMUNITY MAPPING

Community mapping includes various mapping techniques that identify relationships and sites on a map in order to create a tangible display of the people, places and experiences that make up a community. For instance, asset mapping identifies the status, condition, behavior, knowledge or skills of a person, group or entity, which serves as a resource for oneself and others in the community. This method can support strategic planning efforts by building on existing community strengths and is often used in Asset Based Community Development.<sup>29</sup>






- Scenario planning moving towards the desired alternative future scenarios


Testing solutions proposed in Living labs with the community.


